

WHEREAS: contracted terms have been provided to include meters and services per bid #06-018, years 2006-2009, with an optional year in 2010



WHEREAS, the scope of work includes the construction of a second gazebo at Perrotti Park; and



AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF TITLE TEN OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEWPORT, RHODE ISLAND, REVISION OF 1994, AS AMENDED, ENTITLED, "VEHICLES & TRAFFIC."

BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Newport:

SECTION 1. Chapter 10.12 Of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Newport, Revision of 1994, as amended, entitled "**Administration and Enforcement**," is hereby further amended as follows:

**Section 10.12.090. Temporary Rules - Variances to Suit Special conditions.**

**DELETE** Paragraph A and **ADD IN LIEU THEREOF** the following:

"A. ~~The traffic engineer~~ Director of Public Services, by and with the approval of the council, may make temporary rules regulating traffic or may test traffic control devices under actual conditions of traffic. No such experimental rule regulating traffic shall remain in effect for more than thirty (30) days, except as otherwise provided in Paragraph C of this section."


**ADD THE FOLLOWING NEW PARAGRAPH:**

"C. Hazard Road shall be closed to vehicular traffic from December 1 through March 31 of each year, and on any day between March 31 and December 1 when conditions warrant its closure, as determined by the Director of Public Services."

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
