WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH ARPA FUNDS? (Now)



ARPA funds can be used for the following purposes:

- To support the **public health response** to the pandemic
- To respond to the *adverse economic effects* of the pandemic
- To offer extra pay for essential workers
- To improve water, sewer and broadband infrastructure
- And to replace local revenue lost due to the pandemic.

NOTE

These funds will be delivered in two tranches and must be allocated by the end of 2024 and spent by the end of 2026.




3 CONNECTED SOURCES OF FUNDS






General Government Services Any service traditionally provided by Government **INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO**

- protection of critical infrastructure
- Infrastructure, including roads & sidewalks Cybersecurity, including hardware, software, and
- Health services
- Environmental remediation
- School or educational services
- And the provision of police, fire, and other public safety services including the purchase of fire trucks and police vehicles.

Paying interest or principal on outstanding debt, replenishing rainy day or other reserve funds, pension contributions or paying settlements or judgments *would not* be considered provision of a government service, since these uses of funds do not entail direct provision of services to citizens.





Public Health

Support public health response: Fund COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare and certain public health and safety staff

INCLUDE, BUT NOT LIMITED TO

MITIGATING COVID-19

- Vaccine programs
- PPE
- Medical expenses
- public health needs

- Crisis response/hotlines




Provide aid to small business and industries negatively impacted by COVID-19 and its effects on the local economy.





The American Rescue Plan Act

The U.S. Department of the Treasury is beginning the launch of its Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds program which was established by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The Act contains \$350 billion in emergency funding for eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments.

As part of their rollout, Treasury has released details on how these funds can be used in order to respond to acute pandemic response needs; fill revenue shortfalls among these governments; and support the communities and populations hardest-hit by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Rescue Plan funds.

Top three responses

- 1. Roads and sidewalks
- 2. Affordable/Attainable Housing

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS For the Allocation of local ARPA funds

A. GOVERNMENT SERVICES

- 1. Broadband \$1,000,000
- 2. Storm water/sewerage \$ 2,000,000
- 3. General infrastructure support-\$3,000,000
- 4. Social Services/civic support \$750,000
- 5. Miscellaneous/already committed \$550,000

B. DISCRETIONARY

Funding to be determined provided proposal *meets at least one criteria outlined in categories* #4 or #5 and is demonstrably pandemic-related.
