The City of Newport Tree & Parks Supervisor discourages the planting of these kinds of fast-growing, structurally weak trees:

- > Ailanthus or Tree of Heaven
- > Babylon Weeping Willow
- > White Willow
- Box Elder
- > Eastern Cottonwood or Eastern Poplar
- Quaking Aspen
 Others may be added to this list from time to time.

2nd Choose good species & plants

- Should be locally suited.
- > Not too fast-growing.
- > Pest & storm resistant.

1st Scope the larger scene

- > What's the aim?
- How would it fit in with nearby landscapes?

3rd Plant carefully

- > Watch for
- underground lines.
- Allow plenty of space to grow, both upward & outward.
- Don't plant too deeply.

To be certain that there are no utility lines beneath where you want to plant, call *Dig Safe at 1-888-344-7233* at least business 3 days before digging. The utilities in your area will then check it out to make sure it is ok. This is a free service.

Mulch, but not

Avoid "volcanoes" around the trunk.

5th Give tender loving care

Enjoy!

- Brace the trunk the first year or two.
- Water deeply every week first season, then as needed.
- Prune only sparingly, to shape well.
- Don't pave close to the tree.
